Please read over the instructions and make sure you understand the operating procedures before using the unit.

Please check the serial number on your unit. This Manual is for units with serial number 1037279 and above only. For units with serial numbers below 1037279, please contact Newstripe for the correct product manual.









PRECAUTIONARY WARNINGS

- **PLEASE** read and understand <u>all</u> operation instructions as detailed in this manual. Failure to follow specified instructions may result in equipment damage or severe injury to personnel.
- DO NOT use latex paints from hardware stores or home improvement centers in your machine. These types of paints have binders in them that will adhere to the internal parts of the pump, causing damage. You will not be able to clean these substances from the pump. You must use a good quality true water-based athletic field striping paint in your machine.
- **DO NOT** use solvent base paints in this machine. Use only good quality true water-based athletic field striping paint.

NOTE: Damage caused by use of the wrong paint is NOT COVERED UNDER WARRANTY!

- ALWAYS thin the paint in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations prior to use. Most field-marking paints must be thinned before use with the EcoLiner. These paints are typically thinned at a minimum ratio of 1:1.
- **DO NOT** use paint that has not been thinned, as it will clog your machine.
- ALWAYS strain the paint before use. Field marking paint often has oversized material, lumps, and debris. If not properly strained, these contaminates will be drawn into the hoses, pump, and spray nozzle or spray gun where they may restrict paint flow.
- NEVER perform maintenance on the machine while the system is under pressure.
- **DO NOT** use solvents to clean the system. Solvents will damage internal components. Use only warm soapy water.
- **ALWAYS** consult your Facility Safety and/or Personnel Department for specified safety protocols prior to operating this equipment.

ASSEMBLY

- Remove the unit from the box. Check for any damage that may have occurred during shipment. If you see any possible damage, make a note of it on the delivery paperwork and advise Newstripe immediately.
- Set the handles behind the unit with the gun off to the right side. Attach the bottom of the handles to the back of the chassis with 5/16-18 x 1-1/2" hex head bolts, washers and lock nuts. Hand tighten only at this time. (Pic 1)
- Rotate the handle assembly upward and then rotate each handle brace (connected at the back axle) upward so that the holes in the braces line up with the upper holes in the handle assembly. Attach the top of the braces to the handles with 5/16-18 x 1-1/2" carriage bolts, and lock nuts. Tighten all bolts at this time. (Pic 1)



4. Remove the nut and washers from the stud on the drive lever on the left handle, and then grease the stud. Attach the pre-adjusted drive control rod to the stud with a flat washer on either side of it. Tighten the nut so that the drive rod will rotate freely but have no side play. (Pic 2)



 Remove the hairpin clip from the adjuster nut on the bottom of the drive rod. Grease the stud on the adjuster nut and then insert it in the hole in the arm of the drive unit from the outside. Replace the hairpin clip in the adjuster nut to secure it.

Note: The adjuster nut is pre-adjusted at the factory but may need to be slightly adjusted to provide adequate pressure on the tires to drive the unit. (Pic 3)



6. Place the throttle control lever on the engine to the idle position. Place the throttle cable control lever in the up position. Slide the throttle cable through the cable clamp on the engine between the air cleaner and fuel tank and the push the wire of the control cable through the clamp on the engine throttle control arm as shown below. Tighten the screw that secures the wire and then tighten the screw that secures the cable clamp against the cable sheath.

Note: You may remove the engine air cleaner if you need more room to access the cable clamps. (Pic 4)



ASSEMBLY CONTINUED


- Set the pail on the machine as shown below with the return hoses from the handle inside. Connect the lower pump outlet hose to the fitting at the bottom of the pressure valve on the handle and then tighten it with an adjustable wrench. (Pic 5)
- 8. Remove the black cap from the top inlet fitting of the pump. Place the filter end of the suction hose into the pail and then connect the other end to the top fitting of the pump, hand tight only. (Pic 5)
- Connect the spray hose to the elbow fitting that points forward on the right side of the handle and then tighten it with an adjustable wrench. Hang the coil of hose on the fitting assembly. (Pic 5)



- 10. Unpack the spray gun support tube, spray gun mounting bracket, and spray shields.
- 11. Slide the gun support tube with shields into the receiver tube on the front of the machine and then hand tighten the star knobs. (Pic 6)

- 12. Slide the spray gun mounting bracket onto the upright of the gun support tube and then hand tighten star knob. (Pic 6)
- Place the spray gun (without the hose attached) in the gun mount and secure it with the gun mount star knob. (Pic 6)
- 14. Connect the other end of the spray hose to the spray gun and then tighten it with an adjustable wrench.

NOTE: The line width is adjusted by raising or lowering the spray gun and also by selecting the appropriate spray nozzle.



15. **This unit is shipped without oil.** Fill the engine with 20oz of SAE 5W-30 Full Synthetic Motor Oil before starting. Always check the oil level in the engine before starting.

OPERATION

- Adjust the spray shields to a 4" width. You may have to raise or lower the spray gun so that the machine will produce a 4" line. To stripe narrower or wider lines, select the proper spray nozzle from the application description table on page 5. Adjust the spray shields for the line width desired and then adjust the spray gun up or down as needed to produce the desired line width.
- 2. Move the pump engagement lever to the "OFF" position, toward the rear of the machine.
- 3. Disengage the self-propelled drive mechanism by pulling the lever back toward the rear of the machine.
- 4. Add water (for testing, practicing, or cleaning) or pre-thinned and strained paint to the pail.
- 5. On the engine, move the On/Off fuel lever to the "On" position. Move the choke lever to the "choke" position. Move the throttle lever to about the ³/₄ position. Turn the On/Off switch to the "On"

position. Pull the starter cord. Once the engine begins to run, move the choke lever to the run position. Adjust the throttle slightly to where the engine runs the smoothest.

- Move the pump engagement lever to the forward "ON" position. The lever should now be in a horizontal position.
- 7. Open the pump prime valve next to the pressure valve. Lift the lid slightly on the pail and watch the paint flow from the return hose. Once there is a continuous flow from the hose, close the pump prime valve. The unit should now spray when the lever on the handle is squeezed.
- 8. To engage the self-propelled mechanism, simply push the drive lever to the forward most position. Pull the drive lever back to stop. The speed is controlled by adjusting the engine speed.

OPERATIONAL NOTES

- **ADJUST** the side spray shields for line width and then adjust the spray gun height up or down as needed to achieve the desired line width.
- NOTE: water will produce a wider line than paint.
- ALWAYS thin the paint in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations prior to use. Most field-marking paints must be thinned before use with the EcoLiner. These paints are typically thinned at a minimum ratio of 1:1.
- ALWAYS strain the paint before use. Field marking paint often has oversized material, lumps, and debris. If not properly strained, these contaminates will be drawn into the hoses, pump, and spray nozzle or spray gun where they may restrict paint flow.
- ALWAYS prime the pump before each use and when you run the pail dry. If you
 need to reduce the spray pressure, unscrew the pressure valve cap until it is
 where you would like it, and then run the locking ring up against the cap to
 maintain the pressure setting.
- ALWAYS disengage the pump lever when the paint pail becomes empty. Continuing to run the pump when paint has run out will dry paint inside the pump.

CLEANING PROCEDURE

- 1. When your striping job is complete, pull the paint return hose & prime valve hose out of the lid and point them toward the ground behind the machine or into a separate pail.
- 2. Remove the paint pail lid, wipe it off, and set it aside. Pull out the suction hose and wipe or rinse it off, and then place it in a clean container of water.
- 3. Remove the nozzle cap, nozzle, and valve seat from the gun and put them in a container of soapy water to soak.
- 4. Remove the pail of unused paint from the machine and cover it for use the next time you stripe.
- 5. Place an empty pail on the machine and add two gallons of clean soapy water. Place the suction hose in the pail on the machine but leave the return and pump prime hoses out of the pail. This allows you to flush all of the hoses of paint.

- Clean the spray gun parts that have been soaking and then reassemble them onto the spray gun.
 NOTE: The cone shaped depression in the gun seat goes toward the spray nozzle.
- 7. Start the engine and then use the pump prime valve to prime the pump. Activate the spray gun until the spray runs clear with water.

CAUTION: The return hoses will "jump" from the fluid pressure when cycling the prime valve.

- 8. Clean and rinse the exterior of the machine with warm soapy water. **Pressure washing is not recommended.**
- 9. Use soapy water at least once a week to thoroughly clean the pump. Add soap (dish washing detergent) to 2-3 gallons of water, and then run the machine and let it circulate back to the pail as long as desired. Once you have completed this, empty the pail.

CLEANING PROCEDURE FOR WINTER (FREEZING) STORAGE


- 1. Clean as instructed in the normal cleaning procedure.
- 2. Remove as much gas from the engine fuel tank as you can. Run the engine until it runs out of gas.
- 3. Disconnect the paint hoses from the pump and gun and then drain the hoses.
- 4. Remove the screen from the suction hose and hold the end up. Pour a little Newstripe Pump Defender into the hose. Pull the cord on the engine to draw the Pump Defender into the pump. The unit may now be stored in freezing temperatures.
- 5. Drain and change the engine oil in the spring before adding fuel to the tank for the first use.

ITEM	CHECK	MAINTENANCE ACTION
Engine Oil Full Synthetic SAE 5W-30	Prior to every use	Change the engine oil after the first 20 hours of operation and then every 100 hours thereafter.
Paint System	After every use	Clean the paint pail, hoses, and gun.
Hoses and Pump	After every use	Run soapy water through the pump and hoses for additional cleaning.
Wheels and Tires	Check the air pressure before each use.	Fill the tires with air as needed. Grease the wheels monthly.
Handles	Monthly	Check the handle bolts for tightness to the chassis and handle braces.
Engine Air Filter	Monthly	Replace every 4 months






TROUBLESHOOTING GUIDE

PROBLEM	POSSIBLE CAUSE	REMEDY
The pump will not prime.	There is air in the spray system.	Open the pump prime valve and check for flow from the return hose into pail. When the flow is continuous, close the valve.
The pump will not prime after relieving the air in the system.	The pump or hoses may be restricted.	Disconnect the supply and discharge hoses and clean them. Pour hot soapy water into the inlet of the pump and let it soak. Reconnect the hoses and restart the pump.
The pump still will not prime.	The spray system was not thoroughly cleaned after the previous use.	Pour more hot soapy water into the inlet of the pump. Jog the pump by pulling the starter cord several times with engine off to get the soap into the pump. Let it soak 15-30 minutes, and then try pumping water. If the pump starts pumping water, let it circulate the water for 5-10 minutes before adding paint. The pump does not need to be rinsed of the soap, as it will mix easily with the paint. If the pump still will not prime, call Newstripe for assistance. Disassembly of the pump will void the warranty.
The pump will not run.	The drive belt is loose or broken.	Inspect, and then adjust or replace the belt. The belt should deflect approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ between pulleys.
The paint is leaving the nozzle in a stream, and not a spray pattern.	The paint is too thick	Thin the paint.
The pressure too low.	The pressure valve needs adjusted.	Loosen the locking ring. Turn the pressure valve cap clockwise to increase the pressure and then run the locking ring up against the cap to maintain the pressure setting. Do not remove the locking ring.
The spray stream is	The nozzle screen is obstructed.	Remove the nozzle screen and clean or replace it.
inconsistent.	The suction hose screen is clogged or obstructed.	Remove suction hose and screen. Filter the paint, clean the screen, and remove any clogs.
	The spray gun height is incorrect.	Adjust the spray gun height up or down to achieve the desired line width.
The spray pattern is too narrow or is uneven.	The nozzle may be the wrong size, or misaligned.	See the Nozzle Assembly Guide. The nozzle slot must be at 90 degrees to the direction of travel.
	The paint viscosity may be too thick.	Thin the paint in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations.

PROBLEM	POSSIBLE CAUSE	REMEDY
	The control cable is out of adjustment.	Check the cable at the spray gun mount. Adjust the cable as needed or replace it if it is damaged.
	The valve seat in the spray gun is dirty or worn.	Dissemble the gun and clean or replace the valve seat.
Paint drips from the gun nozzle after	The gun is not in the mount correctly.	Adjust the gun position so that the trigger lifting bar allows spray trigger to release completely.
releasing the lever.	Faulty control lever.	Replace the lever if it is worn or damaged.
	The gun mount pivot points or the spray control lever needs lubrication.	Keep all gun mount pivot points, the spray control lever, and pump engage lever lubricated with spray oil containing PTFE, such as Slick 50 One Lube.
The drive rollers are turning but the unit will not move when the drive is engaged.	The drive control rod is out of adjustment.	Remove the hairpin clip that holds the adjustment nut in the drive unit arm. Loosen the adjustment nut jam nut. Turn the adjustment nut clockwise a couple turns, and then reassemble it in the drive unit arm in reverse order. Make sure that both tires are inflated equally for proper engagement.
The drive rollers are not turning.	The drive belt or the drive belt tensioner spring may be broken.	Replace the drive belt or the drive belt tensioner spring as needed.

High pressure pumps manufactured by Newstripe (excluding wear items like diaphragms and valves) are warrantied for materials and workmanship for 12 Months after the date of purchase.

Damage incurred in shipment from Newstripe to the purchaser is the total responsibility of the shipping carrier. The purchaser is responsible for noting any damages on the Bill of Lading of the shipping carrier and Newstripe will work with the shipping carrier to resolve any damages incurred.

The Newstripe obligation under this warranty and any implied warranties is limited to replacement or repair of defective parts of its manufacture without charge for 24 (Twenty Four) Months from date of purchase.
